








CDD builds livelihoods assets

Conclusions from IFAD synthesis

- Effectiveness of CDD
 - Community development funds perform better where strong community structures are the in place.
 - CDD more effective than other approaches in remote and marginalized areas
 - Better results through long term/ programmatic approaches
- Relevance of CDD
 - Local knowledge relevant for problems that require local solutions (food insecurity, climate change)
 - Local ownership for sustainability
 - Effective, accountable and transparent institutions
 - Responsive, inclusive and participatory decision-making



Mutuality, participation and inclusion

- "Reaffirming values of mutuality could refresh and restore politics, business and the environments in which people live". (Collier and Kay, "Greed is dead", 2020)
- Better decision making: Participation and deliberation can lead to more trustworthy decisions that people are willing to accept.
