Overview of the Empowering Women for Leadership Roles Project



Project Context

A part of a broader initiative in the MENA region to advance inclusiveness in governance and leadership for women.

Rationale for the Project

Women remain underrepresented in various sectors due to longstanding political, cultural, and historical barriers.

Project Aim

Address barriers by enhancing women's leadership skills and promoting participation in decision-making.



Methodology



Step1

Most Significant Change (MSC)

Participatory, qualitative evaluation method focused on collecting and analyzing stories of significant change from participants.

Step2

Implementation in Jordan

Gathered stories from women involved in leadership training and included input from stakeholders.

Step3

Focus on Gender and

Empowerment

MSC method effectively captures complex, transformative impacts within gender contexts.





Individual Level Changes





Improved Skills

95% of trained women reported enhanced leadership, communication, advocacy, and management skills.



Young Women Empowerment

90.8% of young women in mentoring programs felt more empowered to lead and initiated community projects.




Confidence Boost

Enhanced confidence has enabled women to take on leadership roles.



Institutional Level Changes





Inclusion of Gender Equality

institutions integrated gender equality and inclusive governance into their programs post-training.



Capacity-Building Participation

women and 61 men participated in sessions promoting institutional change.



Enhanced Decision-Making

The program fostered a more inclusive decision-making environment within organizations.






Community and Environmental Impact

Workshops fostered youth engagement and shifted community perceptions on gender roles.

Significant Change Cases





Case: Women in Sustainable Agriculture

Women mobilized communities to adopt sustainable practices; improved yields and resilience reported.



Case: Environmental Awareness Campaigns

A focused campaign increased knowledge on climate change and improved waste management practices.



Case: Local Governance and Climate Action

Municipal policies now integrate local climate resilience and women's involvement in decision-making.

Enabled capturing nuanced personal stories that quantitative methods might miss.




Increased Engagement

The process demands skilled facilitation and extensive trust-building efforts.




Diversity in Representation

Ensuring diverse representation among contributors is essential to avoid bias.










Combining MSC with Quantitative Methods
