- Annual President's Report on Implementation of Evaluation Recommendations
- Tracks follow-up at project, country, and corporate levels
- Ensures accountability and organizational learning
- Reviewed by Executive Board & Evaluation Committee



## How PRISMA Works




- Management agrees/disagrees with IOE recommendations
- Management self-assesses followup status (fully, ongoing, partial)
- IOE independently validates progress
- Annual reporting combines accountability and learning

Trend: High uptake, slower full implementation for systemic reforms

# What PRISMA Reveals

- Near 100% uptake of recommendations
  strong commitment
- Recurring themes: project design, fragility, climate adaptation, non-lending
- Need for stronger monitoring and evaluation systems
- Divergence between self-assessment and IOE validation

IFAD releases an annual publication – the President's Report on the Implementation Status of Evaluation Recommendations and Management Actions or PRISMA – with two objectives: accountability and learning.

PRISMA summarizes the follow up status of recommendations and distils learning for better project, country and corporate strategy design and implementation.

This tracking tool replaces the former PRISMA Volume II and complies with the accountability objective. It also fosters learning

- Searchable by country, theme, evaluation type

## **Future Prospects**

- Al-enabled PRISMA: chatbot queries, synthesis, predictive alerts
- Decentralized monitoring with stronger field-level inputs
- Integration with country strategies and project design cycles
- PRISMA as a knowledge hub for adaptive management

- Institutionalize follow-up tracking of evaluations
- Balance accountability and learning
- Leverage digital innovation: dashboards and Al
- Ensure government ownership (ACP model)
- Stay adaptive: evolve with critique and needs
